A Parenting Principle

The Bible is a book of commandments, promises and warnings. It is also a book of principles. This includes some very important principles on parenting. One of those principles is found in Ephesians 6: 4, where Paul wrote, "And you fathers, do not provoke your children to wrath, but bring them up in the training and admonition of the Lord." What does this verse teach us about parenting?

First, notice that this verse has both a negative statement and a positive one. The negative statement comes first. We are told "do not provoke your children to wrath." What does this mean? To "provoke to wrath" or anger "involves avoiding attitudes, words, and actions which would drive a child to angry exasperation or resentment and thus rules our excessively severe discipline, unreasonable harsh demands, abuse of authority, arbitrariness, unfairness, constant nagging and condemnation, subjecting a child to humiliation, and all forms of gross insensitivity to a child's needs and sensibilities." In short, it is to arouse to anger unnecessarily, or, as the NIV has it, to "exasperate" a child.

Must we discipline our children? Of course we must! But in keeping with God's will. As James Dobson's excellent book suggested, we must dare to discipline. (See Prov. 13:24; Prov. 23:13-14; Prov. 29:15).

The positive part of the verse says that we are to "bring them up in the training and admonition of the Lord." To "bring them up" is to nurture our children with loving discipline and instruction. To train them is to educate them by both instruction and discipline. It is important, then, that our children get both negative and positive training. On the one hand we are not to provoke them to wrate. On the other we are to bring them up as God directs. May God help us do that!

FATHERS

The Bible has a great deal to say about fathers. For example, the Old Testament tells us to hear the instruction of our fathers (Prov. 1:8, 4:1). A father is to correct his children (Prov. 3:12). We are to respect our fathers (Prov 19:26; 20:20).

The New Testament teaches us to honor our fathers (Mt. 19:19; Mk. 10:19). We are not to curse our fathers (Mk. 7:10). A father is to exhort, comfort and charge his children to do the will of God (1 Th. 2:11). A father chastens his children when it is necessary (Heb. 12:7).

The two most important New Testament admonitions regarding fathers may well be Ephesians 6:1-4 and Colossians 3: 20-21. The Colossians passage tells us that children are to obey their parents because that pleases the Lord. At the same time fathers are not to provoke their children, "lest they become discouraged."

Ephesians 6: 1-4 tells children to honor and obey their parents because not only is it the right thing to do, but because that is a commandment that includes a promise "that it may be well with you and you may live long on the earth." At the same time, fathers are not to provoke their children to wrath, but are to "bring them up in the training and admonition of the Lord."

The Bible is the best book on relationships ever written, and always will be. That is because it was written by God (2 Tim. 3:16-17). It is the best book ever written on parent-child relationships. We thank God for His word!
