Christian Citizenship

Philippians 3: 20-21 is "a grand climax to a great chapter." The passage tells us who a Christian is and what a Christian hopes to be. It tells us for whom we wait and what will happen when He comes. The verses emphasize His return and our resurrection.

Verse 21 says that "our citizenship is in heaven." Paul, a Roman citizen (Acts 22: 22-29), was writing to the church at Philippi, a Roman colony (Acts 16: 12) to remind them that Christians are citizens of Christ's kingdom (Jn. 18: 36). As an early writer wrote, "Christians pass their time upon earth but have their citizenship in heaven."

Christians "eagerly wait." They have an eager expectation. They pray, "Come, Lord Jesus" (Rev. 22: 20). For whom do they wait? "The Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ." Why do they wait for Him? Because He "will transform our lowly body that it may be conformed to His glorious body." To transform is to change or "fashion anew." (See 1 Cor. 15: 35-54). In our resurrection bodies we are to be conformed to a glorious body like Christ's (1 Jn. 3: 1-2).

How is this to be done? "According to the working by which He is able even to subdue all things to Himself." The word for working "is the inspired term for the divine activity and power" (Malone). He is "able" to do this. God has the power to do for us what He did the His Son (Rom. 1: 4). "Thanks be to God, who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ" (1 Cor. 15: 57).
