+ Transfiguration +

Today we are studying the transfiguration of Christ (Mk. 9: 2-8). After we review the context (Mk. 8) we will analyze the text. First we will study the transfiguration itself and see what those disciples with Jesus saw (9:2-6). We will see the time, persons and place involved. We will determine what transfiguration means and what happened to Jesus when He was transfigured. We will see the appearances of Elijah and Moses with Jesus and what they discussed. This will be followed by the proposal of Peter.

The second point of the sermon is the affirmation. Here we will see what the disciples heard. In addition to seeing the cloud (v. 7), they heard the voice of God Himself as He affirmed Jesus as His Son and commanded us to "Hear Him!"

The third part of the lesson deals with the application. What does all of this mean to us? Two things stand out. First, the transfiguration shows us Christ in His divine glory. Second, the voice from heaven that commanded us to hear Jesus emphasizes His divine priority. He is the Son of God (Jn. 14:6).

What is Mark showing us in his gospel account? (1) That Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God (Mk. 1:1). (2) Many suggest that the great theme of Mark is servanthood (Mk. 10:45). As Jesus served, so must we. And that is true. (3) But an equally important theme is His authority. That is a major emphasis in this series of sermons.
