~Role Models~

Having proper role models is very important. However, our culture is far too quick to idolize those who are not good role models at all: entertainers, athletes, politicians, TV personalities and others. That is not to say that all such people are poor role models. Some are not. But far too many are.

If we cannot find good role models in these areas, where can we find them? How about the greatest role model of all: Jesus the Christ, the Son of God and Savior of the world. He is the role model from God.

That is what the Bible teaches in Philippians 2: 1-11. Burton Coffman called Philippians 2 "this exceedingly great chapter" and said that it contains some of the most profound teachings about Christ in the entire word of God. The passage is "an earnest plea for unity." This plea for unity and Christian living is based on the life of Jesus. Verses 1-4 tell us how we should act as Christians. Verses 5-11 describe the role model we are to imitate. "Let this mind be in you which was also in Christ Jesus."

Or, as Paul put it elsewhere, "Imitate me, just as I also imitate Christ" (1 Cor. 11: 1). We are to follow Christ. We are to imitate Christ. Jesus was Paul's role model. He is to be ours. "Let this mind be in you which was also in Christ Jesus" (Phil. 2: 5).
