THE PROBLEM

One exasperated person says to another, “What is your problem?” What is our problem? Our problem is sin. What does the Bible teach about sin? That is our sermon topic this morning: The problem of sin. We will look at three things: (1) the ORIGIN of sin, (2) the UNIVERSAL NATURE of sin, and (3) the OUTCOME of sin.

Sin began for the human race in the Garden of Eden when Satan in the form of a serpent enticed Eve to eat of the forbidden fruit. Eve then convinced Adam to partake of the fruit and sin was introduced into the world (Gen. 3). Paul confirmed this when he wrote, “Therefore, just as sin came into the world through one man” (Rom. 5:12). Again, “For as by a man came death” (1 Cor. 15:21). However, we do not inherit the sin of Adam, contrary to Calvin, but we inherit the consequence of Adam’s sin, which is death (1 Cor. 15: 21-22). That is a major difference!

Sin is a problem for all who have reached the age of accountability. “All have sinned” (Rom. 3:23). If we live and die in our sins the consequence is eternal condemnation (Rom. 6:23). We sin because we make the wrong choices (Josh. 24: 15). “No man can serve two masters” (Mt. 6:24).

The outcome of sin is death (Rom. 6:23; Js. 1: 13-15). The death referred to here is not physical death, but spiritual death in “the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels” (Mt. 25:41). Sin is man’s major problem.
