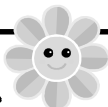

*** The Savior ***

Our Sunday evening sermons are dealing with "Christ and Controversy." They are based on a series of controversies in which Jesus was involved (Mark 2: 1 - 3:6). A controversy is "a discussion marked especially by the expression of opposing views." It is not that Jesus was controversial by design; it is that everything He did and said caused His enemies to try to find fault with Him.

Tonight we look at Mark 3: 1-6, which involved Jesus healing a man who had a withered hand. The fact that it was done at all disturbed the Pharisees. But the fact that it was done on the Sabbath disturbed them even more. In this event Jesus taught a great lesson. In fact, all of these contrivencies have taught the same great lesson. I am convinced that the key to understanding Mark is to understand that his gospel account emphasizes the authority of Jesus. Earlier people had said, "What is this? A new teaching with authority!" (Mk. 1: 27).

Exactly! In this day of doubt and despair we need to understand the authority of Jesus. He is not one among many saviors. He is "the Savior of the world" (1 Jn. 4: 14; Jn. 14: 6).

~ When We Worship ~

Earlier I had announced a four sermon series on who, why and how we worship. However, it was brought to my attention that there is another question that needs to be asked: When do we worship? On what day of the week is the Lord's church to assemble for worship? Why that day? Those questions can only be answered by asking another question: On what day did the New Testament church assemble for worship? Those are the questions we will address today. Why are they important? There are at least three reasons.

- (1) There is at least one religious group that has its worship assemblies on Saturday. There may be other groups that also do this.
- (2) Several large (in particular) denominational churches have--and have had for some time--services on Saturday night, largely as a matter of convenience.
- (3) Even some (again usually large) churches of Christ now offer a Saturday night service, at which they serve the Lord's Supper. Is this for convenience? Or is it because they are trying to "be like all the nations" (1 Samuel 8: 19-20). It is interesting that some of these same churches are among those churches that now offer two types of worship services. One they call "traditional" and the other "progressive". A "progressive" service is one in which instrumental music is usually used as a part of the worship.

These are among the reasons it is important that we ask the above questions about worship.
