RESURRECTION

This year six of our precious Southern Hills members have died. In addition several of our members have lost a loved one or friend to death. This caused me to realize that we need to think about one of the greatest themes of God's word, the resurrection. Both sermons today will deal with that theme. This morning we will focus on the resurrection of Christ. Tonight, based on that truth, we will look at what the Bible says about our own resurrection and the resurrection of those we love from the dead.

The two sermons will follow the same outline. We will begin with an Introduction, followed by Definition, then some Quotations, an Exposition of several passages, and an Application. I tried to look at every verse that referred to the resurrection of Jesus or our own resurrection. I chose 62 passages, most from the NT, that deal with this subject. The result will be what I hope is a rewarding, reassuring and faith-building study.

We will see that the resurrection of Christ from the dead was prophesied, presented and preached. Then we will see that our own resurrection is promised and that it is based on the bodily resurrection of our Lord from the tomb. Some say that the crucifixion of Jesus is the most important doctrine in the Bible, while others insist that the most important teaching is the bodily resurrection of Jesus. The truth is that they cannot be separated (1 Cor. 15: 1-4). We will see that today.
