* SALVATION FROM SIN *

Last Sunday morning our sermon theme was "What Is Salvation?" We saw that salvation is freedom or deliverance from sin. We also saw that salvation comes (1) from God, (2) through Christ, (3) by obedience to the word of God, the gospel. This morning our sermon theme is "Salvation From Sin."

What is sin and why do we need to be saved from it? There are several words and phrases in the New Testament for sin, but the most basic word indicates that to sin is to "miss the mark." It is a failure to live according to the will of God as that will is revealed in Scripture. God's word warns us that we all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God (Rom. 3:23), and that the wages of sin is death (Rom. 6:23). That is not just physical death, as bad as that is, but, even more importantly, it refers to spiritual and eternal death, or separation from God (Js. 1: 12-15).

The Bible teaches that Jesus came to save us from sin (Mt. 1:21). He came "to seek and to save the lost" (Lk. 19:10). He shed His precious blood on Calvary to save us (Mt. 26:28; Eph. 1:7; Col. 1:14). The writer of Hebrews says that animal sacrifices could not remove sins (Heb. 10:4). But without blood there could be no salvation (Heb. 9:22). So Christ shed "His own blood" for our sins (Heb. 9:12). The blood of Christ saves us from sin (Heb. 9:14-15).
