The Gospel

The word gospel means the good news of what God has done—and does—for us through Jesus Christ. The angel told the shepherds, “I bring you good tidings of great joy.” What were they? “There is born to you this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord.” (Luke 2:10-11).

Paul called the gospel “the power of God to salvation.” (Romans 1:16-17). It is the good news from God that brings salvation. He added that the “things of first importance” in the gospel were the death, burial, resurrection and ascension of Christ (I Corinthians 15:3-4). Paul also penned several important points about the gospel. First, he had preached the gospel. Second, they have received the gospel. Next, they were to stand in the gospel, and they were saved by the gospel. Notice the condition. “If you hold fast that word which I preached to you—unless you believed in vain” (I Corinthians 15:1-2).

When Philip heard the eunuch reading Isaiah 53, he asked, “Do you understand what you are reading?” The man replied, “How can I, unless someone guides me?” Luke adds, “Then Philip opened his mouth, and beginning at this Scripture, preached Christ to him.” (Acts 8:35)

As they came to the water, the eunuch asked, “What hinders me from being baptized?” And he was (Acts 8:36-38). How did the eunuch know he needed to be baptized? Because Philip “preached Jesus to him.” To preach Jesus is to preach “the whole counsel of God” (Acts 25:27), including God’s plan for salvation. ~ Dan Cottrell
