CHRIST DIED FOR US

We are preaching a series of sermons based on the theme of "The Love of God." Last Sunday we studied John 3:16 in both the morning and the evening sermons. Both of today's sermons are from Romans 5: 6-11. They are based on the statement, "Christ died for us" (Rom. 5: 8). This morning we will study Romans 5: 6-8 and tonight we will study Romans 5: 9-11. These verses support what we said last Sunday about the love of God for us.

First we will remember what we were like before we came to Christ and obeyed His gospel. We were ungodly (5: 6), sinners (5: 8) and enemies (5: 10). Romans 5: 8 makes it very clear that these terms refer to us.

Then we will see what we are in Christ. We are justified (5:9), saved (5:10) and reconciled (5:10-11). Then we will think about why we are what we are. It is because "Christ died for us" (5: 8). He saved us from wrath (5: 9) through His death (5: 10) and His shed blood on the cross (5: 9).

Our closing thoughts will consider what we conclude based on this passage. First, we "rejoice in God through our Lord Jesus Christ" (5: 11). Then we think about what it means to be reconciled to God through His Son (5: 10-11). Finally we relate this back to the two sermons of last Sunday. It is all because of the love of God for us.
