No Condemnation in Christ

Today we will continue our study of the love of God as we turn our attention to Romans 8. Over a series of lessons on this great chapter, we will see at least three important things. (1) There is no CONDEMNATION in Christ (vs. 1-4). (2)There is no COMPLICATION in Christ (v. 28). (3) There is no SEPARATION in Christ (vs. 35-39).

We cannot fully appreciate these points unless we understand the context in which they were written. Romans begins with the most lengthy of introductions to any of Paul's letters (1:1-15). The theme of the letter is introduced in 1:16-17. Romans 1:18-3:20 emphasizes the fact that both Jews and Gentiles need Christ and His gospel. That point is summarized in 3:23.

But a complete change of emphasis begins in 3:21 with the words, "But now." From this point on the emphasis is on Christ and the gospel. The section is summarized by 5:1.

Romans 5 through 8 is about our freedom in Christ. Chapter 5 says we are free from death, while chapter 6 says we are free from sin. Chapter 7 deals with freedom from the Law of Moses, and chapter 8 points out that we are free from condemnation. So we come to chapter 8, where Paul discusses the three things listed in the first paragraph. As someone said, if chapters 1-4 tell us that we are justified by faith, chapters 5-8 tells us about our freedom in Christ.
