Resurrection Appearances

In 1 Corinthians 15 Paul affirmed the importance of the gospel. He had preached it to the Corinthians, who had received it, stood in it, and were saved by it, if they held fast to it (vs. 1-2). At the heart of the gospel Paul had delivered to them were the death, burial and resurrection of Christ, all of which were "according to the Scriptures" (vs. 3-4).

At 1 Corinthians 15:5 Paul begins a partial list of those who had seen the resurrected Christ. He lists Cephas, the twelve, more than five hundred brethren at once, James, all the apostles and himself (vs. 5-11).

Then the apostle gives several consequences that result from denying the resurrection. If there is no resurrection, Christ was not raised, gospel preaching is vain, our faith is worthless, those who proclaim the resurrected Christ are false witnesses, we are still in our sins, those who have died in Christ have perished, and we are of all men most to be pitied or miserable (vs. 12-19).

Beginning at verse 35 Paul asks, "How are the dead raised? And with what kind of body do they come?" After observing that there are different kinds of bodies (vs. 36-41), Paul describes the resurrection body as imperishable, glorious, raised in power and spiritual (vs. 42-49).

Finally, Paul ends the chapter with the assurance of our resurrection. "We will all be changed" into imperishable and immortal bodies. By God's grace we will be given "the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ" (vs. 50-58). We are to abound in the work of the Lord, assured that our labor in the Lord is not in vain.
