EVANGELISM

Evangelism is “the winning or reviving of one’s personal commitment to Christ” (Webster). It refers to leading a person to Christ through teaching them the saving gospel (Rom. 1: 16-17). It means to teach the “good news” or “glad tidings” about the salvation that comes only through Him (Jn. 14: 6).

Two things are important here: (1) the NEED for evangelism and (2) the PURPOSE of evangelism. First there is the NEED. We do not have to be reminded that all around us people are lost in sin (Rom. 3: 23; Rom. 6:23). Billions of people around the world need to hear the gospel of Christ. Some of them are your friends, neighbors, family members, classmates, business associates and others. If we do not tell them about Christ, who will?

Jesus told us to “Go into all the world and preach the gospel to every creature” (Mk. 16: 15). As the late Ivan Stewart said, “Go ye means go me.” God put the church on this earth to live for Christ and teach the gospel of Christ. Are we? If not, why not? What kind of excuse can we give the Almighty for not telling others about His Son and His saving gospel?

The PURPOSE of evangelism is to lead others to Christ. All around us, both near and far, the world is continuing to grow in numbers of people. God is giving us opportunities on top of opportunities. There are many and we must seize them. Let each of us become an evangelist for Christ!
