Love the Lord

First John 4 is one of the great Bible chapters. It discusses three fundamental points: (1) God’s love for us; (2) our love for God; and (3) our love for each other.

First, there is God’s love for us. He manifested His love toward us by sending His only begotten Son that we might live through Him (4:9). His Son is the propitiation for our sins (4: 10). God sent His Son as the Savior of the world (4:14).

Second, there is our love for God. “We love Him because He first loved us” (4: 19).

Third, there is our love for each other. “Let us love one another” (4: 7). “If God so loved us, we also ought to love one another” (4:7). “If we love one another, God abides in us, and His love has been perfected in us” (4: 12). If we love God we must also love each other (4: 20). “He who loves God must love His brother also” (4: 21).

All of this is based on Matthew 22: 34-40. A lawyer asked Jesus, “Which is the great commandment in the law?” Jesus answered that we are to love God with all of our being (Mt. 22: 37). To this He added that there is a second commandment. We are to love our neighbor as ourselves (Mt. 22: 39). That command is “like it.” Those two small words indicate how important love for neighbor is. If that is true, think about how important our love for other Christians is (Jn. 13: 34-35)!
