Faith and Works

What is the relationship between faith and works? James 2: 14-26 answers that. James teaches that there are two kinds of faith. There is a dead faith (vs. 14-20) and a dynamic faith (vs. 21-26).

Remember what was said last Sunday about faith. It is the substance of things hoped for and the evidence of things not seen (Heb. 11: 1). It is impossible to please God without faith (Heb. 11: 6). We are saved by grace through faith (Eph. 2: 8-10). We walk by faith and not by sight (2 Cor. 5: 7). Whatever is not from faith is sin (Rom. 14: 23). We are justified by faith (Rom. 5: 1).

James first discusses a dead faith. The passage begins with a question (v. 14), followed by an example (vs. 15-16). Then comes the principle (v. 17), which is repeated in vs. 20, 24 and 26. There is a challenge (v. 18), followed by an example of a dead faith (v. 19).

Then James discusses a dynamic faith. He begins with the examples of Abraham (vs. 21-23) and Rahab (v. 25). Four times the principle is repeated in the passage (vs. 17, 20, 24, 26). Faith without works is dead, being alone. The works referred to are not the works of the Law of Moses, but works of righteousness. In other words, James is referring to keeping the commandments of God as recorded in the new covenant (Mt. 7: 21, Jn. 14: 15). Faith without those is a dead faith, but obeying God's will is a dynamic faith.
