The Crucifixion of Christ

For several months the Sunday morning Bible class that meets in the auditorium has been studying the Gospel of Luke. Today in that class we will conclude Luke 22. For this morning's sermon I would like to move ahead to Luke 23 and use it as the basis for our lesson as we remember the crucifixion of Christ. "When they came to the place called the Skull, there they crucified Him" (Lk. 23:33 NASB).

Next Sunday morning, Lord willing, we will follow today's lesson with a sermon on the resurrection of Christ, based on Luke 24. These two topics are at the heart of the gospel of Christ (1 Cor. 15: 1-4).

Tonight we plan to preach the sequel to last Sunday morning's sermon, which was "Live Like Christ," based on Philippians 2: 1-4. Those verses emphasize how we as Christians are to live. The lesson tonight will study Philippians 2: 5-11. These verses will show us our model or pattern for Christian living, Jesus Christ Himself.

In case you have not heard (though I think I may have mentioned it a "couple" of times): Today I conclude fifty years of trying to preach the gospel. That means that next Sunday, Lord willing, I will begin my fifty-first year of trying to "Preach the word" (2 Tim. 4: 2). To paraphrase the classic Jimmy Stewart movie title, it has been "A Wonderful Life." Yes, there have been a few "downs," but many more "ups." I thank all of the brethren and churches who have allowed me to attempt to preach, and most of all, of course, I thank God and my Lord Jesus Christ.
