The Kingdom of God

Last Sunday night we studied the phrase "the kingdom of God" (Mk. 9:1). Jesus prayed "Your kingdom come" (Mt. 6:10). What is the kingdom of God? Has it come? How did it come? When and where did it come? Is it present today? We will continue that line of thinking tonight with a second lesson on the kingdom. It is a very important lesson. I hope you will be here.

Last week we looked first at the PROMISE of the kingdom. We studied Isaiah 2: 1-5, Micah 4: 1-3, Daniel 2: 44 and Daniel 7: 12-13. God promised through the OT prophets that the kingdom would come. Then we saw the POWER with which the kingdom did come (Lk. 24:49; Acts 1:8; Acts 2:4; Acts 2:15; Acts 2:17; Joel 2:28-32).

Tonight we will consider two more very important points. The first is the PRESENCE of the kingdom. Passages like Matthew 16:18-19 speak of the kingdom as yet future. However, the pivotal chapter in this study is Acts 2, at which we have already looked, but at which we will look again as necessary. Then we will examine Colossians 1:13, Hebrews 12:28 and Revelation 1:9. The passages before Acts 2 for the most part speak of the kingdom as yet future, while those after Acts 2 speak of the kingdom as a present reality.

Finally, we will see the POINT about the kingdom. The kingdom is defined as both the rule and reign of God and where that is (the realm). In short, the kingdom is the church. We will see that tonight.
