Going Against Giants

Do you sometimes feel that you spend a large part of your life going up against giants? There are gigantic obstacles and problems in the lives of all of us. They must be faced and dealt with. They can, and they can be overcome with God's help. The pressures, worries, fears, challenges and dangers of life are often before us. But, "If God is for us, who can be against us?" (Rom. 8: 31).

The valley of Elah is located about fourteen miles southwest of Jerusalem. It is a deep valley between two mountains. Through it runs a brook (or wadi) that is filled with water in the rainy season, but dry in the dry season. The bed of the wadi is covered with small stones, like the five that are important in 1 Samuel 17.

Here the armies of Philistia and Israel were arrayed against each other, with the Philistines on one mountain and the Israelites on the other. A champion of the Philistines, named Goliath, stepped forth to challenge the army of Israel. He was nine and one-half feet tall. His armor weighed two hundred pounds and the head of his spear weighed twenty-five pounds. He challenged Israel to send out a warrior to fight him, but no Israelite stepped forward until a young boy named David did.

In 1 Samuel 17 David encountered three people who were obstacles in his life. The first was his oldest brother, Eliab. The second was Saul, the king of Israel. The third was the giant Goliath. How did David deal with these obstacles? How are we to deal with the obstacles in our lives? What lessons can we learn about facing and dealing with the obstacles in our lives from 1 Samuel 17? That is the lesson this morning.
