THE SINLESS CHRIST

The Bible is the inspired word of God (2 Tim. 3: 16-17). The gospel is the power of God unto salvation (Rom. 1: 16-17). Man's greatest problem is sin (Rom. 3: 23; 6: 23). The solution to the problem of sin is Jesus Christ. Why? Because of His eternal nature (Jn. 1: 1-18; Col. 1: 13-17). And because of His virgin birth (Isa. 7: 14, Mt. 1: 18-25, Lk. 1: 26-35).

Today we will continue to see what the Bible says about why Jesus is God's solution to the problem of sin as we study the sinless nature of Christ. First we will look at the temptation of Jesus by Satan (Mt. 4: 1-11). This point will include a look at 1 John 2: 15-17, where the three major categories of sin are listed. Then we will analyze Hebrews 2: 18, where we are told that because Jesus was tempted He is able to aid those who are tempted.

The third point is that, though He was tempted, Jesus was "without sin" (Heb. 4: 15). Then we will see that Jesus is eminently qualified to be the Son of God (Mt. 16: 16), Savior of the world (Jn. 4: 42), and Master and Lord.

Based on what was said above we will make four points of application. We saw how Jesus dealt with the problem of temptation. How do we deal with temptation and sin? (1) We remember that Jesus is our Lord. (2) We pray to God for help when temptations come. (3) We obey God. (4) We seek the help of fellow Christians.
