LOVE ONE ANOTHER

For the last several weeks our sermons have emphasized love. There were four sermons on God's love for us and one sermon on our love for Him. Today is the final lesson in the series. Our theme is "Love One Another." Today's sermon consists of three great principles, each related to and built on the ones before it.

The first principle is the truth that God loves us. In fact, He loves us so much that He gave His Son to die for our sins and arise for our justification (Rom. 4:25; Jn. 3:16-17). (See also 1 John 4:9, 10, 14, 16.) The second principle is our love for God. We are to love Him with all our heart, soul and mind (Mt. 22:37). That is "the great and foremost commandment" (Mt. 22:38 NASB).

The third principle, the one we are studying today, is that we must love each other. Jesus said that the second commandment was like the first. We are to love our neighbors as ourselves. Then He added, "On these two commandments depend the whole Law and the Prophets" (Mt. 22:39-40). (See 1 John 4:7, 11, 12, 20, 21; John 13:34-35.)

Someone wrote, "Love of one's brother (or sister) derives from God's love; and without love for one's brother (or sister), there can be no relationship with God." (See 1 Corinthians 13.) As Leon Morris observed, "There is nothing more important in the Christian's life than love." That is love for God, love for fellow Christians, and love for others.

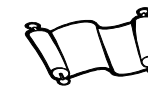
