~ CITIZENSHIP ~

One of the most important and unique words in the Bible is citizenship. "For our citizenship is in heaven, from which we also eagerly wait for the Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ" (Phil. 3: 20). The word refers to "the heavenly status of believers" (Vine). It is closely related to the word "conduct" (Phil. 1: 27). "Only let your conduct be worthy of the gospel of Christ." In other words, our conduct as Christians should be characteristic of our heavenly citizenship. As citizens of heaven we should conduct ourselves accordingly.

At some points in time it and other closely related words denoted foreign colonies, such as Philippi, which were populated by retired Roman soldiers and other Roman citizens. In keeping with that line of thought, Christians are a colony of heaven on earth. But the real point is that our true home is heaven. That is why Peter called us "sojourners and pilgrims" (1 Pt. 2: 11), and reminded us that our inheritance is "reserved in heaven for you" (1 Pt. 1: 4).

Note that we "eagerly wait for the Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ, who will transform our lowly body that it may be conformed to His glorious body" (Phil. 3: 20-21). How can He do that? "According to the working by which He is able even to subdue all things to Himself." He will raise us from the dead and give us glorious resurrection bodies by His power. (See 1 Thessalonians 4: 13-17 and 1 Corinthians 15). What a beautiful promise from God through Christ through His word!
