THE WORD OF GOD

It is observed that the letter of James is a mix of the doctrinal and the practical. It begins with a section on how to deal with the trials of life (1: 1-12). That is followed by a section on temptation (1: 13-15), which is followed by two verses on the giving and the gifts of God (1: 16-17).

In verse 18 James introduces us to the word of truth which is the gospel. James also calls it “the implanted word” (1: 21) and “the perfect law of liberty” (1: 25). He encourages us to “be doers of the word, and not hearers only” (1: 22). In this practical section he tells us that we are to be “swift to hear, slow to speak, slow to wrath” (1: 19). We must avoid wrath because “the wrath of man does not produce the righteousness of God” (1: 20 NKJB).

James is dealing with Christian conduct. How are we as Christians to live our lives? According to the will of God. That is what James 1: 19-27 teaches. We will be studying this powerful passage in our next three sermons. We must live our lives by God’s word (1: 18, 21, 22, 25).

God’s word guides us as to how we should hear, speak and react. It teaches us what to do. It also teaches us to avoid anger, filthiness, wickedness and misuse of the tongue. It teaches us to care for those in need and to keep ourselves from sin. The word of God has a vital role in our lives.
