~ The Last Week ~

Today we are continuing our studies in the Gospel of Mark. We will look at Mark 11. The morning sermon, "The Triumphal Entry," will study the entry of Jesus into Jerusalem (vs. 1-11) and the cursing of the fig tree (vs. 12-14, 20-26).

The evening sermon, "The Question of Authority," will be a study of Mark 11:15-19 and 27-33. This sermon will include a look at the second cleansing of the temple in Jerusalem.

These two lessons introduce the activities and teachings of Jesus during the last week of His earthly life. The series will include chapters 11-16. The last lessons in the series will include the crucifixion, resurrection and ascension of Jesus.

Someone may wonder why we would study such a series of lessons. In fact, some may wonder why we would devote a lengthy series to the Gospel of Mark at all. Because, as Mark clearly states in the first verse of his gospel account, he is writing about "the gospel of Jesus Christ, the Son of God." In the postmodern world in which we live, many reject the biblical teaching about Jesus Christ altogether, while others see Him as at best only one potential savior among many. But the Bible, the word of God, proclaims Him as God's Son and the Savior of the world. He is the one and only Savior (Jn. 14:6; 1 Tim. 2: 5-6). For that reason we have devoted several sermons to a study of Mark's gospel.
