The Second Commandment: Guarding God's Glory

The second commandment teaches that God must not be misrepresented. In Exodus 20:4–6, the Lord forbids the making of carved images. While the first commandment addresses whom we worship, this commandment addresses how we think of and approach Him. The surrounding nations shaped their gods in wood and stone, reducing the divine to something visible and manageable. Israel was forbidden to do the same.

At Sinai, the people demanded something they could see (Exodus 32). The golden calf was not presented as a new god, but as an image meant to represent the Lord. Yet that act brought judgment (Exodus 32:7–35). Later, Jeroboam repeated the sin (1 Kings 12:28). The problem was not artistic creativity; it was distortion. As Deuteronomy 4:15 reminds us, Israel “saw no form.” God is spirit (John 4:24), and to confine Him to an image dishonors His nature.

Scripture explains this command in terms of God's jealousy (Exodus 20:5). He is not insecure, but zealous for His glory. Interestingly, God has provided one true image of Himself: humanity, made in His likeness (Genesis 1:27–28). We are meant to reflect Him in character, not replace Him with objects.

This command also reminds us that sin spreads through generations, yet mercy extends to those who love Him (Exodus 20:6). There is always hope through repentance.

Ultimately, the danger is not only carved images but distorted ideas. Ethics begins in the heart (Matthew 5:21–30). We must guard how we think about God, refusing to reshape Him into something easier to grasp. When we honor Him as He has revealed Himself, we preserve both His glory and the integrity of our obedience.

MISSIONS MEMO...

**Kilimanjaro Missions • Noel Stafford
& family • Tanzania, East Africa**

Hello from Kilimanjaro Missions team, like a farmer watching a crop grow after waiting and wondering what was going on under the soil, so is life on the mission field. We are seeing some promising developments, some positive changes, and some very encouraging growth. There are new faces at church services almost every week. Young people are growing up and becoming more involved. I see my children helping teach Bible classes, leading singing and joining in personal evangelism.

Last month, we were blessed with visitors from the States. My brother Paul and his family were with us. They joined the Kilimanjaro and Mweka youth for a retreat to the Rau Forest. We also attended the annual Tanzania Youth Seminar in Kisongo. About 20 young people from Moshi and Mweka were in attendance.

The Missions team, along with brethren from the congregation, have been conducting evangelism in different areas of Moshi. The response from area to area differs. Sometimes we find that an area is light on residents and is therefore a good place to hand out tracts but not good for repeat Bible studies. We continue to adapt as we learn what works where.

We continue to evangelize weekly, moving to new areas of town and sowing the seed among the Moshi population. We continue to study with several people who, for various reasons, have not yet committed their hearts to God. Please keep these Bible studies in your prayers.

One of the Massai ladies, Rehema obeyed the Gospel! However, there was no place to baptize her, so we contacted a longtime friend Elly Martin who immediately made a portable baptistry for us. We now have a way to baptize others who live in rural bush villages! What a blessing. Evangelism and church growth is vital to the survival of this congregation. Thank you for your vital support and please continue to pray for all our efforts to spread the Gospel!
